

# Riddrie Library User Guide

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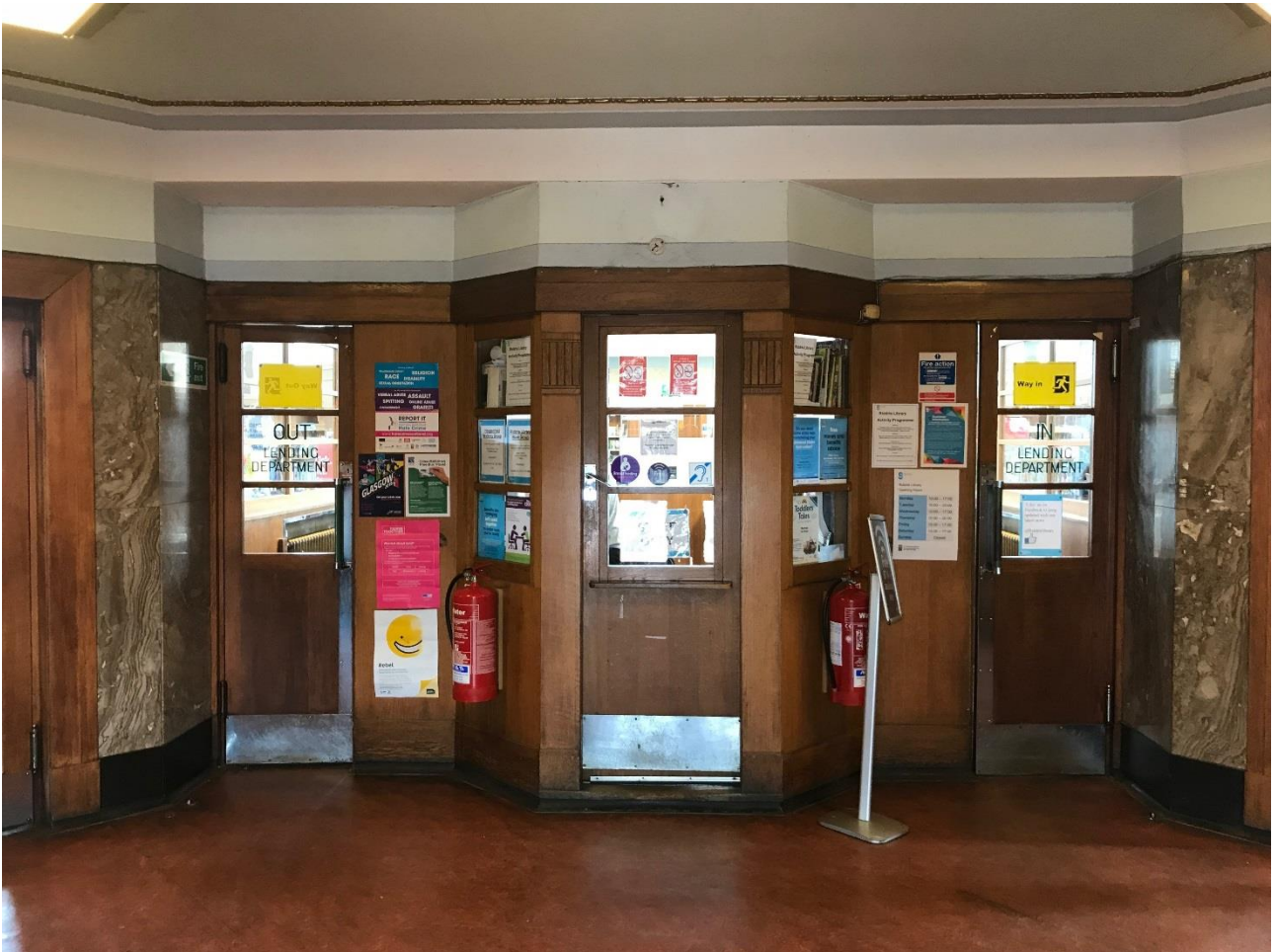
The aim of this guide is to support children, young people and adults with autism to access the venue and the services it offers.

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# Welcome to Riddrie Library



In front of you after entering you will see 3 doors. Use the door on the right that says “way in”



On entering through the swing doors you will find the Information desk.



Sometimes there might not be a member of staff at the desk but if help is needed, someone will come to help as soon as they can.

A member of library staff will be wearing a badge like this and will be able to help you.



To take out books you will need a library card. To get a library card you need to bring something with your name and address on it to the library. You will also need to fill in this form. Staff will be able to help you.



There are also toilets that can be used when at the library and could be used by anyone visiting.

The toilets are next to the front door. You will need to ask the staff for a key.



This is the quiet area. This can be found next to the computers.
