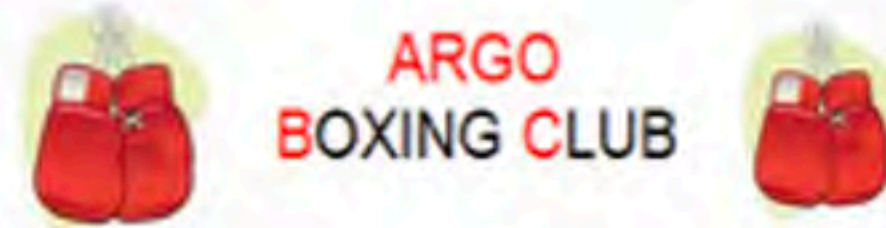

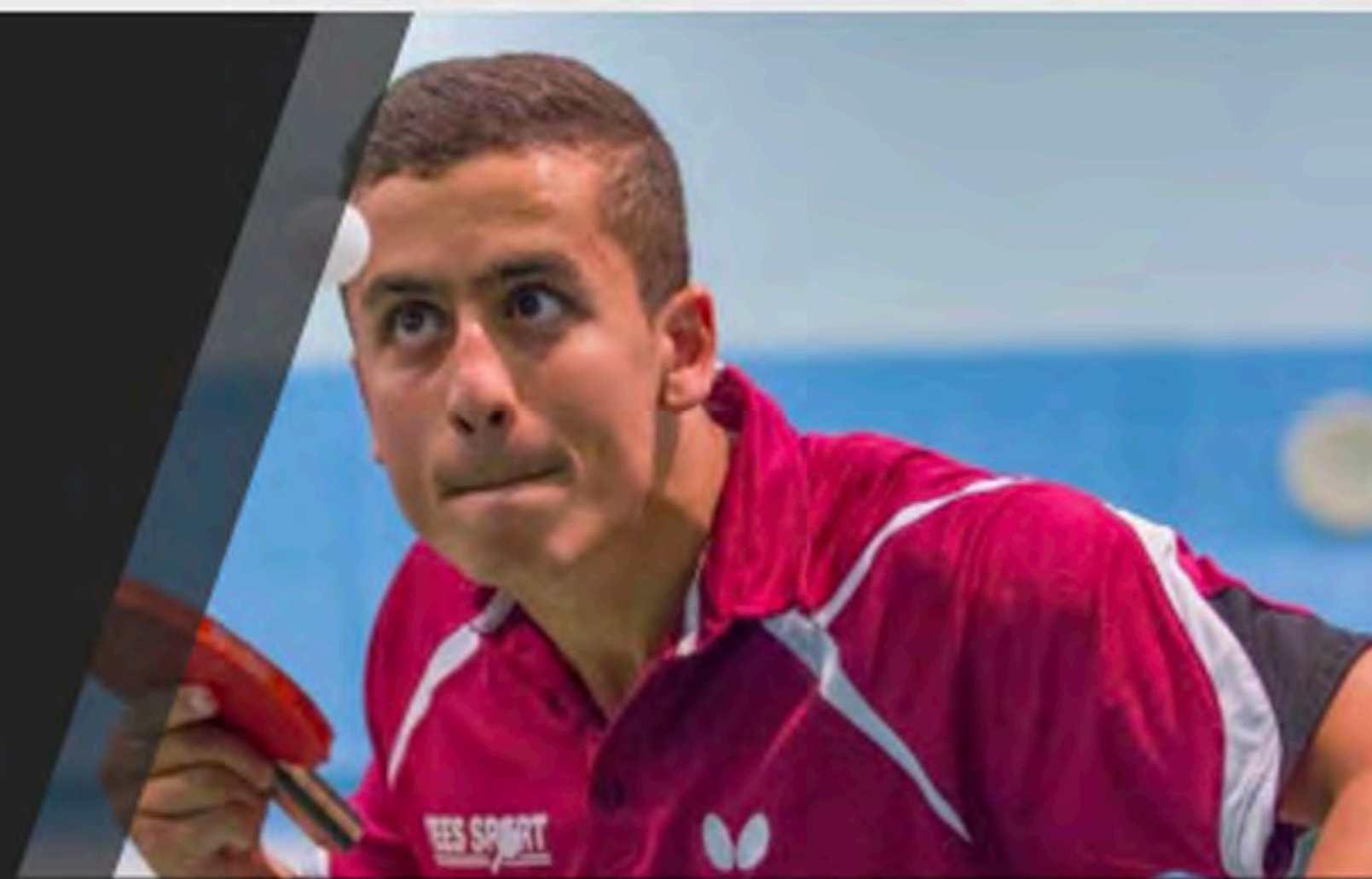



# European Capital of Sport Fund

## Phase 1

- Fixed amount of £750 to support projects taking place between January and June 2023.
- £42,750 awarded across 57 organisations in December 2022.
- Funding provided to support activity in 22 of Glasgow's 23 wards so far.

## Phase 2

- Fixed amount of £750 to support projects taking place between July and December 2023.
- Applications open on 1st April and close on Monday 8th May 2023.
